## **Chief Administrative Officer's Report**

## Retirement Counseling and Processing

Ms. Maloney reported all members expecting their first payment on July 31<sup>st</sup> were processed. This month staff will be adjusting the supplemental dependent allowance paid to accidental disability retirees and accidental death survivors to reflect the COLA increases awarded by PERAC.

Ms. Maloney informed the Board that the System is using an outdated version of PERAC's Application for Voluntary Retirement. Staff will distribute the current version to members and employers.

#### PERAC Notification - M.G.L. c. 32, Sec. 91A Compliance

Five disability retirees have not complied with the statutory filing requirements regarding the 2016 Statement of Earned Income. Further, the retirees did not appear for a scheduled show cause hearing. As a result, all five individuals will have their retirement benefits terminated this month as required by the law.

#### Eligibility Review - Pension Forfeiture List

PERAC has promulgated a listing of members whose pensions have been forfeited and who are no longer statutorily eligible to participate in a Chapter 32 system. Per PERAC's request, staff is currently conducting a thorough review to ensure none of the System's current members appear on the list. This list will also be used for vetting of future enrollments.

#### Regional Training Sessions

The MCRS Pension Education Series will resume next month. The schedule is as follows:

## FY 2018 Appropriation

All 71 units have submitted their July 1<sup>st</sup> payments. To date, the System has received \$111,744,642.50. The outstanding \$334,355.50 is due January 1, 2018. Further, Ayer Housing Authority has asked PERAC to review the significant increase in its FY 2018 appropriation.

#### **Investments**

Ms. Maloney referred the Board to her written report with respect to investment performance. The Board directed Ms. Maloney to schedule investment manager reviews at the September Board meeting for Globespan and Global Forest Partners.

## Financial Condition of the System

The Board reviewed the cash balance sheet and financial condition of the System.

Ms. Maloney will obtain certificate of deposit rates on the 6- month CDs that are up for renewal. Next the Board reviewed the agency cash available at State Street Bank.

On Motion duly made by Mr. Curtin, Seconded by Mr. Brown, it was Moved to transfer \$40 million from State Street to the PRIT Fund, effective August 31, 2017.

#### Solect Energy Development

The Board discussed its recent decision to enter into agreement with Solect Energy Development to install solar panels on the roof of 25 Linnell Circle. Upon legal review of the contract, both the Chairman and Ms. Maloney identified significant concerns with the arrangement. As fiduciaries to the members and beneficiaries of the System, and after consideration of other uncertainties regarding the building, the Board is not in favor of moving forward with the proposal.

On Motion duly made Mr. Kearns, Seconded by Mr. Healy, it was Moved to reconsider its prior vote to engage Solect Energy Development to install solar panels on the building's roof.

#### **PRIM Update**

As of June 30<sup>th</sup>, the PRIT fund has outperformed its benchmarks. PRIM's Advisory Committee, on which the Chairman serves, will meet on September 19<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Litigation Update**

The Chairman updated the status of appeals before the Division of Administrative Law Appeals and the Contributory Retirement Appeal Board, and reviewed recent cases.

#### Outreach

The Board discussed inviting town managers to attend the December 13, 2017 Advisory Council meeting.

#### **Election of the Fourth Member Documentation**

The Board discussed the explicit guidelines in place in order to certify nomination papers for candidates for the Fourth Elected Member. The Board will revisit the method by which addresses of members of the System will be made available to candidates. The Election Board Meeting is scheduled for November 3<sup>rd</sup>.

## Second Employment Position

The Board acknowledged more review and discussion is required with respect to issues involving members employed in multiple units within Middlesex County Retirement System.
