

Fall Newsletter, Regional Member Meeting and Election of the Fourth Member

The Board welcomed, via conference call, Melissa Hurley of MJH Communications to discuss respective assignments and articles for the Fall Newsletter. The deadline to submit articles is September 29th.

Next Ms. Maloney reported that the Regional Member Meeting held on September 12th at the Senior Center in Chelmsford was another successful program, with approximately 100 members in attendance. The evaluations were favorable. Ms. Maloney will forward the photos taken at the meeting to Ms. Hurley for use in the Newsletter.

The Board next discussed the ballot mailing for the Election of the Fourth Member, in the event an election is necessary. To address some concerns noted in the prior 2016 election, the outer mailing envelope will be re-designed to add color. The return envelope will replace the member's name with a unique numeric identifier.

This concluded Ms. Hurley's report.

Next the Board reviewed and approved agenda items #3 through #17.

Chief Administrative Officer's Report

Ms. Maloney referred the Board Members to her written report for a detailed summary of the System's activities since the last Board meeting.

Retirement Counseling and Processing

Ms. Maloney reported that payments to all members who were expecting their first payment in August were processed, with one exception. Further, staff has distributed the updated version of PERAC's Application for Voluntary Retirement to members and employers and it has been posted on the System's web-site.

PERAC Notification - G.L. c. 32, s. 91A Compliance

PERAC notified the System of five retirees who have not complied with the filing requirements of G.L. c. 32, §91A regarding the 2016 Annual Statement of Earned Income. Accordingly, their retirement benefits were terminated.

Eligibility Review - Pension Forfeiture List

PERAC has promulgated a listing of members whose pensions have been forfeited and who are no longer statutorily eligible to participate in a Chapter 32 system. To ensure none of the System's current members appear on the list, staff conducted a

thorough review and discovered six name matches. Additional identifying information will be requested from PERAC to rule out eligibility issues.

Payroll Processing

With respect to 2017 payrolls, 97% are posted through July and 79% are posted through August. Staff continues to audit member accounts on a regular basis.

Requests from Members

Ms. Maloney is seeking guidance from the Board with respect to the System's policy pertaining to requests from members that require original signatures. Often in lieu of original signatures, members are customarily allowed to submit a scan of their signature with the assurance they will mail their original request. Currently there is no consistent policy in this regard. Mr. Gibson and Ms. Maloney will review this matter further and report back to the Board.

Investments

Ms. Maloney referred the Board to her written report with respect to investment performance.

FY 2018 Appropriation

Ms. Maloney reported that she has been working with the Chairman and Kathy Riley of the Segal Company to address Ayer Housing Authority's increase in its FY 2018 appropriation. A solution has been proposed and Segal is currently preparing the financial information for the Board's review.

Military Service Credit

The majority of units have responded to the System's request for a list of employees who have been called to active duty between January 1, 2010 and December 31, 2016. Twelve units have identified employees with active military service for this time frame. Invoices will be mailed next week with a July 1, 2018 due date.

Financial Condition of the System

The Board reviewed the cash balance sheet and financial condition of the System.

Per the Board's request, Ms. Maloney provided updated certificate of deposit rates on the six month certificate of deposits (CD's) that were up for renewal with Belmont Savings Bank and Reading Cooperative Bank. Both financial institutions increased the interest rate to 1.35%.

Business Owners' Insurance Policy Renewal

Ms. Maloney reported to the Board that while additional quotes were sought, Liberty Mutual remains the most competitive.

After review,

On Motion duly made by Mr. Curtin, Seconded by Mr. Brown, it was Moved to renew the Business Owners' Insurance Policy and Umbrella Liability Policy with Liberty Mutual and approve payment of the premiums in the amount of \$15,774.00.

The Spire Corporation's Use and Occupancy Agreement expires September 30, 2017. Spire has requested a one-month extension to October 31, 2017. Spire's occupancy beyond that date remains uncertain, and Ms. Maloney will keep the Board apprised on the matter.

NCG

George Sharis of NCG is continuing his efforts to remove storage items to reduce the 10,000 sq. footage of the premises he is occupying. The cleanup is expected to be completed this month and at that time the Board can determine the appropriate fee for the new space.

At 12:05 P.M. the Board recessed for Lunch.

The Board reconvened back into regular session at 12:45 P.M

At this time the Chairman delivered his report.

PERAC Update

PERAC has issued a Memorandum to all retirement boards pertaining to their fiduciary obligations relative to the selection of the Board's Fifth Appointed Member and personnel hiring. The matter is scheduled to be on the agenda for discussion at the upcoming MACRS Conference. While the Chairman stated the Board has always maintained an open process in this regard, he stated it may be appropriate to update the System's Policy.

The Chairman complimented Ms. Maloney's participation on the "Retirement System Best Practices" panel at the September 14th PERAC Emerging Issues Forum. PERAC officials and other attendees reported that they were favorably impressed with Ms. Maloney's presentation.

PRIM Update

The Chairman attended PRIM's Investor Advisory Council meeting on September 19th. The PRIT Fund has performed well and is up 10% for 2016. Fossil fuel divesture was also discussed. PRIM's Investor Conference is scheduled for

November 9, 2017 at the College of the Holy Cross. Board Members can earn three educational credits for attending.

Litigation Update

The Chairman updated the status of appeals before the Division of Administrative Law Appeals and the Contributory Retirement Appeal Board, and reviewed recent cases.

Legislative Update

A Legislative Hearing on amendments to the pension forfeiture law is scheduled for October 10th at the Public Service Committee. Amending legislation as it pertains to Option C retroactive pay is expected to be considered shortly.

Second Employment Position

Following the Board's last meeting, the Chairman presented a Supplemental Regulation relative to the "Second Employment Position" involving members employed in multiple units within Middlesex County Retirement System. Additional review and discussion is required.

At 1:30 P.M. the Board welcomed Paula Barrett of Insight. Inc. to discuss personnel matters. The Board Secretary departed the meeting and did not return.

Review of Employee Handbook and Benefits

Ms. Maloney reported that she and Ms. Barrett are finalizing the Employee Handbook revisions with the intent to share a final draft with the Board at its October 25, 2017 meeting. It was noted that December 26th is a discretionary holiday now. Ms. Maloney has requested December leave slips from staff for the Board's consideration. A Summary of Employee Benefits will be presented at the October 25th meeting as well.

The revised Sick Leave Bank Policy has been shared with staff. All but two employees have enrolled so far. The enrollment deadline is September 28th.

Student Intern

Ms. Maloney reported that Matthew Halko, a senior at Shawsheen Valley Technical High School, has been selected as the intern to assist the office during the 2017-2018 school year.

Review of Employee Compensation

The Board continued its review and discussion of employee compensation and benefits.

After review,

On Motion duly made by Mr. Healy, Seconded by Mr. Curtin, it was Moved that the System continue to maintain its two current existing longevity payment structures for employees; effective FY 19, longevity payments up to \$7,500.00 per year will be awarded to employees who were hired before July 1, 2010.

The Motion Passed.

Next the Board reviewed the employee educational incentive payments.

After review,

On Motion duly made by Mr. Curtin, Seconded by Mr. Healy, it was Moved that the System continue to maintain its current existing percentage based educational incentives for Associate's Degrees, Bachelor's Degrees and Master's Degrees as follows:

- Associate's Degree: up to \$2,000 per year
- Bachelor's Degree: up to \$4,500 per year
- Master's Degree: up to \$6,000 per year

The Motion Passed.

Ms. Barrett departed the meeting.

Investment Manager Reviews

The following managers underwent an annual investment manager review, via conference call, pursuant to 840 CMR 16.07:

Global Forest Partners – Chris Warrington Globespan – Andrew Goldfarb

The managers presented performance and investment reports detailing the managers' activities which the Board reviewed. The Board compared the managers' performance with the Retirement System's investment goals and policies. The Board ensured that comprehensive written quarterly reports were filed with the Board and with PERAC. These reports included a review of investment and relative performance, a review of the System's investments, and a report on the investment managers' forecast and strategy for the future.

The Board determined that the investment managers continue to operate in the manner represented when retained and outlined in the agreement between the Board and the manager.

At this time, the Chairman resumed his report.

CB Richard Ellis

The Chairman reported that he is reviewing the terms of CBRE's proposed contract for services. The Board also discussed whether a contract was necessary.

Supplementary Investment Regulation

The Board discussed the need for a Custodian Bank and the applicability of PERAC's regulations 840 CMR 16.04 and 16.07 to the Retirement System as the System is a Participating System in PRIM.

After review,

On Motion duly made by Mr. Healy, Seconded by Mr. Curtin, it was Moved to adopt the Supplementary Investment Regulation as drafted by the Chairman, and to submit same to PERAC for approval.

The Motion passed.

Building Update

Next George Nangle, Building Supervisor, joined the meeting and confirmed Ms. Maloney's report that the System's tenants, Spire Corporation and NCG Office Systems, are downsizing. As noted, Spire will be vacating the premises in October, and NCG Office Systems continues to dispose of equipment in storage in an effort to reduce the space it needs to occupy. Mr. Nangle reviewed the list of upcoming capital improvements.

On Motion duly made by Mr. Brown, Seconded by Mr. Healy, it was Moved to Adjourn at 3:15 P.M.
