Chief Administrative Officer's Report

Ms. Maloney referred the Board members to her written report for a detailed summary of the System's activities since the last Board meeting.

Retirement Counseling and Processing

Ms. Maloney reported on the number of counseling appointments and applications for superannuation retirement to be processed for the month of November.

Next, she discussed the current practice by which superannuation retirement applications are processed by staff. Upon receipt, applications are reviewed and accepted by the Board at a meeting prior to staff beginning calculations. According to Ms. Maloney, this process, at times, can result in delayed payments to members.

After review,

On motion duly made by Mr. Healy, seconded by Mr. Kearns, it was moved that staff begin the calculation process for applications for superannuation retirement prior to formal acceptance by the Board.

The motion passed.

Retiree Payroll

Ms. Maloney reported on the continued backlog of calculation approvals at PERAC. Of concern, specifically, are seven disability retirement calculations.

After review,

On motion duly made by Mr. Kearns, seconded by Mr. Brown, it was moved to pay all PERAC-approved disability retirees their first monthly retirement allowance upon calculation by staff, and to pay any retroactive payments upon approval by PERAC of the System's calculations, effective immediately.

The motion passed.

<u>Dependent Benefits/Student Verification Process</u>

The biannual dependent benefits/student verification process is complete. To ensure that there are no overpayments issued to dependent children, the Board discussed a more frequent review of the dependent children's eligibility for benefits. Further consideration is necessary.

PERAC Notification - M.G.L. c. 32, §91A Compliance

PERAC continues to verify salaries of the System's disability retirees who have reported earnings in an amount that may result in an adjustment to their disability retirement allowance in accordance with G.L. c. 32, § 91A. In addition, the Board has been notified that three disability retirees still have not complied with the filing requirements of G.L. c. 32, § 91A regarding their 2018 Annual Statements of Earned Income. In an effort to give the retirees the opportunity to explain why their benefits should not be terminated, show cause hearings have been scheduled for November 19, 2019.

1099 R Processing

Staff will begin reviewing the 1099R data after the November 29, 2019 retiree payroll. For the second consecutive year, the System will be outsourcing the printing and mailing of the 1099R Forms.

Benefit Verifications

Ms. Maloney reported that calendar year 2020 is a benefit verification year. In February, affidavits will be sent to the System's benefit recipients to ensure their continued eligibility to receive benefits.

Payroll Processing

Ms. Maloney reported that all units are posted through September and 76% are posted through October.

Finance and Investments

Ms. Maloney referred the Board to her written report with respect to investment performance.

State Retirement System - 3(8) (c) Invoices

Ms. Maloney reported on a recent conference call between the State Retirement System and Middlesex County Retirement System regarding the outstanding 3(8)(c) payments owed by Middlesex County Retirement System to the State Retirement System for the period 1998-2010. In advance of the meeting, she furnished the State Retirement System with research with respect to the payments which identified fifty retirees that appear to be the source of significant discrepancies. The State Retirement System took the information under advisement and are researching their records.

Next, the Board discussed the County abolition and the outstanding transfer of County assets from the State. The Board agreed to resume further discussions with the Commonwealth's Executive Office of Administration and Finance to resolve the matter.

System Operations

U.S. Census Bureau - Annual Survey

The U.S. Census Bureau is conducting the 2019 Annual Survey of Public Pensions. The Retirement System completed the survey on November 7, 2019.

Enterprise Bank – Fraudulent Debit Charges

Enterprise Bank's Fraud Detection Unit recently alerted Ms. Maloney of suspicious charges on the System's debit card. According to Ms. Maloney, this is the second time in five months one of the System's accounts has been compromised. The Board discussed whether to continue use of the debit card or seek personal reimbursement for System related expenses. Since the card maintains a low minimum balance, the consensus of the Board was to keep the debit card but continue to monitor and be vigilant with its usage.

Building Update

Riverside Glass Company was assigned the work associated with the replacement of two windows on the lower level. The installation is expected to occur by the end of the month. At the last meeting, the Board directed the Chairman to contact Billerica Town Manager, John Curran, regarding negotiating a flat fee for the System's sand supply. The Chairman has contacted Mr. Curran for this purpose but has not received a response. He will keep the Board apprised of the matter.

Finally, Ms. Maloney discussed the need to develop a backup plan for snow and ice removal in the event the Facilities Coordinator is unavailable.

Education

NPEA Conference

Ms. Maloney and Mr. Curtin reported on their attendance at the NPEA Conference held in Naples, FL, October 19-23. Both agreed it was of great value, and specifically commented regarding the presentation on post-traumatic stress disorder and presumption protocols. Among other topics of note were effective communication practices, and retirement and estate planning.

NCPERS Conference

Mr. Brown reported on his attendance at the NCPERS Public Safety Conference, held October 27-30 in New Orleans, LA. The program content included valuable presentations on effective leadership in emergency management crisis, investment diversity, and investing in infrastructure. Mr. Brown reported that overall, the conference was very useful.

At this time the Chairman delivered his report.

PERAC Update

PERAC's Commission meeting is being held today. At this time, the Chairman stated there is nothing new to report.

PRIM Update

PRIM's meeting is scheduled for tomorrow. The Chairman is expected to attend.

World Timber Fund Offer

Global Forest Partners has evaluated and is recommending the acceptance of an offer from an existing investor in the RII World Timberfund to acquire all the investor interests, including an indirect purchase of the fund's 49.95% interest in Green Triangle Forest Products in Australia, and its 100% interest in Oro Verde in Uruguay. The Chairman has reviewed the documents, participated in a conference call with other limited partners, and recommends the Board ratify his prior notice

to Global Forest Partners of its acceptance of the offer, which is non-binding. The target date for closing is early 1st Quarter of 2020.

After review,

On motion duly made by Mr. Healy, seconded by Mr. Brown, it was moved to ratify the Board's acceptance of the non-binding offer to purchase with respect to the World Timberfund investment.

One Digital

The Chairman reported that representatives from One Digital are amenable to the Board's request for a reduced fee for human resources consulting services as of December 1. Further information will be forthcoming.

Election of the Third Elected Member

The Chairman congratulated Joseph Kearns on his re-election to the Board and expressed his appreciation for Mr. Kearns's contributions to the Board and the System's members and beneficiaries over the past three years. Official notification of Mr. Kearns's re-election will be provided to all interested parties.
